## Church History

By the 1890's Salt Lake City's small Black population had gained sufficient enough numbers as to encourage the formation and support of independent institutions that provided African-Americans with the opportunity to give greater meaning to their lives. In addressing their spiritual needs, group of Blacks who identified themselves as the Baptist Prayer Band, met and held worship services in their homes. By 1892, the "Baptist Prayer Band" was clearly established as "The Calvary Missionary Baptist Church" and identified as the "little colored house of worship in the alley."

In June of 1896, Rev. A. E. Reynolds announced in the "*Broad Ax*" (a Black newspaper) that a building located in the rear of a white church was available as a place of worship for Black Baptists. January, 1898, Rev. D. Jones arrived in Salt Lake City from Topeka, Kansas to pastor Calvary Missionary Baptist Church. He was replaced in 1901 by Rev. J. W. Washington, an energetic person whose leadership was instrumental in the church's growth during his tenure. On Sunday, June 29, 1902, the pastor and members of the congregation gave an afternoon and evening reception at their new chapel located at 472 East Second South. In 1911, the Eastside Baptist Church site was purchased by the Calvary congregation from Immanuel Baptist Church. The first services were held on February 5<sup>th</sup> at the 679 East Third South location. Rev. Allen Newman, pastored the church from 1913 to 1915.

In 1921, under the leadership of Rev. George Hart, the Calvary Baptist Church was incorporated by the State of Utah. Between 1924 and 1954, Calvary had eight pastors. In 1951, the Articles of Incorporation were revised and approved by the membership. The Rev. William I. Monroe served as pastor of Calvary from 1954 to 1967. During his tenure, the church membership made great strides in terms of its membership and financial condition. On November 3, 1966 the Calvary congregation joyfully marched from their former worship place at Third South and Seventh East to their new place of worship at 532 East Seventh South. Special services culminated the activities of this day.

In 1974, Rev. France A. Davis was installed as pastor of Calvary. Pastor Davis has served the congregation for over thirty years, a period longer than any of his predecessors. During his tenure, Calvary has continued its ongoing mission. In 1989 Rev. Davis and the Calvary congregation dedicated Calvary Towers, a low-income senior citizen housing complex. A scholarship fundraising initiative was launched in 1992. Supplemental funding is provided to Calvary youth who upon completion of high school enroll in a college or university. Throughout its history, Calvary Baptist Church has sought to address secular as well as spiritual needs of its congregation and the larger community. Such notable individuals as Booker T. Washington and Danny Glover have used Calvary's facilities to share their expertise with Utahns of diverse backgrounds.

## Church History (continued)

The steady increase in Calvary's membership required the addition of an 8:00a.m. Sunday worship service in 1994. It became clear that the existing church site was inadequate to meet the needs of the congregation and its community-based initiatives. In 1995 the congregation authorized a fundraising effort for a new church building at a site that would be located in the Central City area of Salt Lake City. In November of 2001, Rev. France A. Davis and his proud congregation dedicated and celebrated the occupancy of the new church site at 1090 South State Street. Local and state political, religious, and community leaders joined with members of the community to launch a new era in the history of Calvary Baptist Church. In the spirit of sharing its good fortune and acknowledging its commitment to spreading the word of God, Calvary Baptist's leadership and congregation aided the Church of Tonga's efforts to occupy and purchase Calvary's former building at 532 East 700 South Street.

The new church building's 47,000 square feet have been very important in the expansion and enhancement of Calvary's Outreach activities. Community based programs such as the Rescue Mission, Rescue Haven and Odyssey House have some of their clients participating in Calvary's worship services. The educational enrichment program brings a number of young people to Calvary for after school help in computer and literacy tutorials. Calvary's seniors gather weekly for conversation and other activities. Calvary's facilities are often utilized by community organizations whose activities are in keeping with Calvary's religious and community mission. We feel blessed by God who has provided us with a marvelous leader and the resources to carry out our Christian responsibilities.

During the past 12 months, we had an exciting youth oriented revival, developed our Senior Ministry, held our Church picnics on the church grounds and put the facilities to better use with dance, play, scouts, and sports teams. Our numbers continue to grow as does our spirit and maturity. ## About our Anniversary Speaker.....

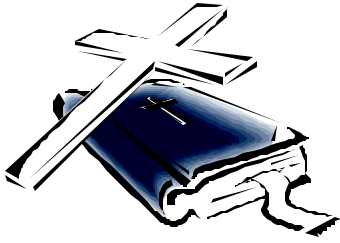

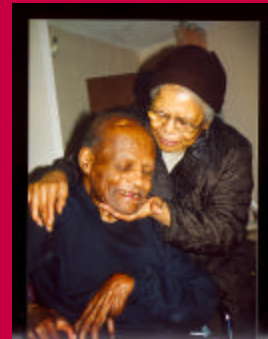
